AB 2680 - Community Health Navigators

Summary

AB 2680 advances health equity by connecting trusted community messengers with historically excluded low-income Californians in order to help enroll, retain, and encourage the utilization of Medi-Cal benefits in these vulnerable populations.

Background

Medi-Cal currently serves about 13 million Californians, the majority of which are people of color or speak English as their second language. This number will soon increase to approximately 14.6 million Californians according to California's Department of Health Care Services (DHCS). This growth is partly due to efforts to help people stay enrolled during the COVID-19 public health emergency, as well as the upcoming Health4All Medi-Cal expansion to all income-eligible Californians regardless of immigration status.

In 2019, California passed AB 74 which established a pilot program for Community Health Navigators. Community Health Navigators ("Navigators") are a critical and effective community-based tool for removing obstacles to health care for many low-income communities of color, immigrants, and other Limited English Proficient (LEP) groups. They serve as an invaluable resource to communities who have often gone without health care coverage for generations due to lack of awareness or ability to navigate complex enrollment systems. The funding from that pilot project will be ending on June 2022, leaving a gap for the thousands of Californians that have come to rely on the expertise of Navigators.

The state needs to establish a new program to ensure that Navigators can continue to provide life-saving services to enroll, retain, and encourage utilization of Medi-Cal benefits. With the expected influx of people that will be eligible for Medi-Cal, either due to the COVID-19 pandemic or efforts to expand benefits to undocumented Californians, it is critical now more than ever to ensure the State has the infrastructure to readily serve the needs of linguistically and culturally diverse communities.

Addressing the needs of low-income Californians requires utilizing Navigators through Community Based Organizations (CBOs), who are uniquely positioned, trained, and experienced in the community. Most importantly, they have well-established, trusting relationships and a sociocultural understanding of the populations they serve.

Current Law

Stats 2019, Ch 23, the 2019 Budget Act allocated funds toward Community Heath Navigator pilot programs.

Stats 2021, Ch 76 established a similar program for Community Navigators assisting connections between families and generic services as well as community centers.

This Bill

AB 2680:

- 1) Creates the Community Health Navigator Program within DHCS to make direct grants to qualified CBOs to conduct targeted outreach, enrollment, retention, utilization, and access activities for individuals and families eligible for Medi-Cal;
- 2) Prioritizes CBOs that can serve the following populations: immigrants, LEP groups, homeless, seniors, disabled, pending release from incarceration or formerly incarcerated, and LGBTQ+.
- 3) Provides training and technical assistance to grant recipients;
- 4) Requires evaluation and reporting of reaching state and regional outreach and enrollment goals;
- 5) Requires coordination between CoveredCA, state, and local entities to ensure a seamless approach to enrolling all Californians in health care coverage.

AB 2680 has a companion 2022-23 Budget proposal.
